What a busy week we had at Pembroke Primary School, full of fun and exciting learning experiences.

Life Education Van

The Life Education Van visited our school last week to provide a range of fantastic health programs to our students. I attended some of the sessions and found the students to be highly engaged in their sessions.

Topics included:

- Foundation: My body matters

- 1/2W: Safety Rules

- 3/4BC: All Systems Go

- 4/5C: BCyberwise

- 6G: Relate, Respect, Connect

Students learnt about healthy bodies, making safe choices, how body systems work, cybersafety and how to build respectful relationships both in person and online.







STEM Update

Last week in STEM, we continued to explore the work of Mathematician Tadashi Tokieda. The year 3/4 students investigated the 'Climbing Binder Clip'. Using just wool attached to a pivot point, students were able to use a few simple movements to get their binder clip to climb up or down the string. Students had to use careful observation skills to try to understand what was happening, including filming the experiment in slow motion with an iPad.

Another highlight has been the Year 6 end of year Passion Projects. Students are able to choose any STEM project to complete independently, applying the knowledge and skills they have developed through their participation in the STEM program. There are some great projects underway, including building circuits using electronics kits, advanced robotics, growing crystals, making coloured celery and creating animations and games using Scratch and Flipaclip programs.

Auslan

Students have continued to explore the topic of food in Auslan classes this term. Junior students have been enjoying shopping in the Auslan food market to practise their signing. A highlight this week was when the year 6 students cooked a traditional Chin soup, using vegetables grown in the Garden of Diversity. It smelled delicious! Well done 6G!

There will also be a **Curriculum Day on March 6th** for all schools in the Lilydale District.


